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Предисловие

Настоящее учебное пособие предполагает возможность реализации обучения иностранным языкам в двух вариантах (в зависимости от исходного уровня иноязычной коммуникативной компетенции студентов):

- основной уровень (для начинающих изучать данный иностранный язык) в диапазоне уровней A1–A2+ (допороговый уровень владения иностранным языком по Общеевропейской шкале уровней владения иностранными языками);
- повышенный уровень (для продолжающих изучение данного иностранного языка) в диапазоне уровней от A2+ до B1+ (пороговый уровень владения иностранным языком по Общеевропейской шкале уровней владения иностранными языками).

Лексическое наполнение пособия представлено образцами употребления лексики как в британском, так и в американском вариантах английского языка. Грамматический материал пособия отобран в соответствии с принципом: от простых грамматических конструкций до сложных грамматических явлений и видовременных форм.

Структура пособия, помимо лексического минимума и основного текста по предлагаемой теме, включает следующие компоненты: а) комплекс заданий, нацеленный на тренировку лексико-грамматических навыков по повседневной тематике (General English); б) профильные тексты на английском языке для дополнительного чтения (ESP Texts); в) материалы для овладения деловым английским языком (Business English); г) вспомогательные материалы: полезные интернет-сайты, краткий справочник по фонетике и грамматике английского языка, "Jazz Chants for Each Unit" и "List of Irregular Verbs", д) вопросно-ответные упражнения и примерная тематика проектов для организации самостоятельной работы студентов.

В результате изучения материалов издания студенты должны освоить:

Generation Gap

Do you know what a generation gap is? Even if you don't know the particular definition, you are aware of this problem, basing on your own experience. Generation gap is a popular term used to describe serious differences between people of two generations.

To realize how to deal with it, you should keep in mind that generation gap includes several aspects: children must know as much as possible about their parents and parents — about the world outlook of their children, about relations between brothers and sisters, and also about the attitude to them of close relatives on both sides — father's and mother's.

Children demand a great deal of attention, time and patience, so, if you are not ready to devote all that to your baby, it is better not to hurry. There are many families where both parents keep working after giving birth to their baby It is similar to the situation with a single-parent family, when a father or a mother hardly have enough time and neglect their children's upbringing. In such cases most of the time the child has to spend on his own or with his friends. Due to the fact that he has not got any guidance from his parents, he may be involved in some bad companies which commit violence or even crime and become alcohol or drug addicted. When the parents discover that, it's usually too late to change anything.

On the other hand, there is a different situation when the parents treat their children too strict and don't give them any freedom at all. In this case the children may become pariahs (отверженный) among their peers. Constant bans may increase the risk that the child will grow up insolent and defiant. This causes another big problem — lying. The child is forced to lie to the parents because of the fear to be punished. It can be anything from putting on make-up in the girls' room at school to stealing.

Some children rebel against discipline and family values. They listen to a loud music, wear inappropriate, to their parents' mind, clothes, dye their hair in inconceivable colours, have all their bodies pierced and tattooed trying to show their independence and establish their identity. They want to be treated as adults, but they are not ready to take all the necessary responsibilities. It doesn't mean that your child is bad and he will become a criminal. Of course, not! It only means that your child is in his transitional age and he is in need of your understanding and support.

But how to handle such behaviour? Parents should become his close friends. First of all they should learn to respect his interests. Try to speak with him as often as possible, offer some parent-child activities like shopping or going in for sports. It is worth involving the child in discussing some family questions, just to show that he is a full member of the family. Moreover, children in their teens are very vulnerable when they are criticized in public, so try to avoid it. Parents should always be honest and sincere with their child; otherwise it would be unfair to require the same from him.

Too authoritarian parents can't do any good to their children as well as parents who overindulge all the child's caprices. Overindulgence may lead to the same results as negligence. There are parents who are afraid of hurting the child by banning something when it is necessary. Such parents risk becoming powerless in the family and losing control over their children who may become spoiled and capricious.

It demands to make a great effort from both parents and children to reach mutual understanding. There are many different opinions on the question of treating children if they disobey their parents, but every parent should decide for himself what will be best for his child and set him on the right path.

The House of My Dream

A person's home is as much a reflection of his personality as the clothes he wears, the food he eats and the friends he spends his time with. Everybody has in mind an "ideal house" and an "ideal home". How do I see my "ideal house", how do I see my life there?

There are many kinds of dwellings, from town houses, which include terraced houses, semi-detached, detached houses, to country houses.

Here is a brief description of the house I dream of. My bathroom is very good-looking: the walls are tiled in cream, the washbasin, the toilet are pastel pink. My towels are also pink. Then I go to the kitchen to have breakfast. It is always pleasant to cook in it because it is very comfortable. I make my tea and sandwiches and have breakfast. Then I go to my work, but in the evening "there is no place like home". I have rest in the living-room. I can sit on the sofa and read or watch TV. Then I go to the bedroom. It is my favourite room. Here I sleep and see my sweet dreams.

British Homes

There are 22 million homes in Britain — big homes and small homes, old cottages and new buildings, houses and flats. (Americans say "apartment", but British people say "flat"). Many British people love old houses and these are often more expensive than modern ones. They also love gardening and you will see gardens everywhere you go: in towns, villages and out in the country.



Some are very small with just one tree and a few flowers. Others are enormous with plenty of flowers and enough vegetables and fruit trees. Two third of the families in Britain own their houses.

Millions of these houses are the same with two or three bedrooms and a bathroom upstairs, a dining-room and a kitchen downstairs. To pay for their house, home owners borrow money from a "building society" and pay back a little every month.



My Day

My working days are very busy. I usually wake up at 7 o'clock, do morning exercises, take a shower and have breakfast. For breakfast I have a cup of tea or sometimes instant coffee with sandwich with cheese and butter. At this moment, I like to listen to the morning news on the radio or TV. At 8.00, I take my bag and leave for the University.

It takes me half an hour to get there. I usually take a bus and if I am not in a hurry and the weather is fine, I get to the University on foot. In that case I have to start earlier. We usually have three double periods a day. Our schedule is rather heavy: we have two or three different subjects daily and we are supposed to be prepared for each of them.

During the studies we fulfil various assignments. Some of the tasks we carry out on our own. The work we do depend on the particular subject. In a math class we can do problems or sums, calculate or prove theorems. In a class of literature, we discuss literary works, their styles and peculiarities. In a history class we speak on different issues and discuss them. In an English class we speak, read and write English. We ask and answer questions and make dialogues and stories.

Apart from regular classes, some of us take optional or preparatory courses. They have flexible class hours.

Our classes are over at about two o'clock, but my working day continues. I usually go home after classes, but occasionally I drop in at the library, or do some shopping, or just take a stroll with my friends.

After lunch, I get down to my homework. When I am through with it, there is some time left for doing something else — reading or going for a walk. But not every day. I am taking my additional preparatory courses on Monday, Wednesday and Saturday. Besides, I still attend my sport club regularly. Naturally, I have to work more intensively on these days. Sometimes, I visit my friends

or just watch a TV programme. Yesterday was not an exception. My friends came to my place and we saw a very interesting video film.

Hobby

It *has been* a long time since the word "hobby" became a part of our vocabulary. A hobby is an activity which you enjoy in your free time. It may be a quiet activity like collecting stamps, growing roses or playing a musical instrument. Many people use this word to denote everything they like doing.

The most popular hobbies are philately, collecting view-cards, coins, stamps badges and books. Some people are interested in modern architecture. Others are interested in photography. A useful hobby is collecting cassettes. You may have recordings of operas and pop music, folk music and jazz concerts. It's impossible to describe all hobbies known in the world. The main thing is that they enrich our knowledge in some particular field, broaden our outlook and help us to relax.

Hobbies differ like tastes. If you have chosen a hobby according to your character and taste, you are lucky because your life becomes more interesting.

As for me, I have a few hobbies: amateur photography, computer games, music, DVD s collecting, and reading.

I have always been fond of photography. It gives pictorial records of our lives. I like taking pictures of my family, my friends and some particular events: birthdays, visits, trips, matches, and so on.

I am also very keen on computer games. Some of them are really fascinating, absorbing, and beautiful. Playing computer games, you

can fly a helicopter, drive a car, find yourself among numerous enemies in an old castle or get back to the era of dinosaurs. I am well aware that some people strongly disapprove of computer games.

I enjoy listening to modern music. I prefer music with rhythm you can dance to. I have been collecting various CDs for the last few years and now I have lots of them. Due to this hobby of mine, I learn a lot about the latest trends in modern music. In addition to it, I read magazines and watch television music programs to keep up.





In the kitchen garden different vegetables (cabbage, turnips, carrots, cucumbers, onions, beans, garlic, peas, celery, dill) are grown. When I *come* there in spring I sometimes dig the ground and plant the seeds with my granny.

Not far from the village there are large woods with big old oaks, birch-trees, willows, lime-trees, maples. In summer, very often my friends *visit* our place in the country, and we have splendid walks in the woods. When they *come* to visit us, we go to the forest where we pick mushrooms and berries. My grandmother used to cook us a very tasty mushroom soup.

There is a big lake near our village. I often get up very early in the morning, swim in the lake and sometimes go fishing.

When I *come* to my granny in summer, I regularly *go* to the bank of the lake to swim, play volleyball, badminton, and go boating. In the evening, we *sit* round the camp fire and sing songs or tell stories. We *have* a very good time in summer.

C. Ecology

The air over urban and industrial centers has become foul and the waters — filthy. Clouds of factory smoke above our cities used to be a sign of growth and prosperity, but now we know that health can be seriously harmed by air pollution.

Property damage by air pollution can cost billions of dollars each year. About 30 per cent of today's air pollution comes from factories and electric power plants, and about 50 per cent from car, truck and bus exhaust.

Polluted air dirties our clothing, our buildings, and our homes. Air pollution, by stunning the growth of trees and plants, also reduces agricultural productivity and adds to the price people must pay for food.

Burning fossil fuel in cars and factories releases pollutants into the air. Then dust and moisture combine in the atmosphere to form acids in clouds, and eventually there is an acid rainfall or snowfall. The results are deadly. Acid rain kills fish and plants in lakes. It also builds up in the soil and damages crops. It wears away building surfaces. Blown by winds, the acid rain may fall far from the source of pollution.

Water is considered polluted when it cannot be used for its intended purposes, such as drinking, recreation, farming, or manufacturing. Pesticides and chemical fertilizers used by farmers and home owners pollute streams, rivers, and ground water when they are transported by rain-water runoff.

Modern technology produces massive amount of wastes. Unlike ordinary household and commercial garbage that can be safely disposed of in open pits or other types of dumps, industrial wastes are often toxic (poisonous). That is why a nuclear power plant or an enterprise producing chemicals can become an environmental nightmare. Toxic wastes deposited at dump sites have already contaminated the land, air and underground water in the immediate areas in many countries. This threatens the health and well-being of those who live nearby.

Some people are fond of winter. They consider winter to be the healthiest season. In winter, we can go in for winter kinds of sports: skating, skiing, and tobogganing. 

A. British Meals

The usual meals in Britain are breakfast, lunch, tea, and dinner. Breakfast is generally a bigger meal than on the Continent, though some English people like a "continental" breakfast of rolls and butter and coffee. But the common English breakfast is porridge or cornflakes with milk or cream and sugar, bacon and eggs, marmalade with buttered toast, and tea or coffee. For a change you can have a boiled egg, cold ham, or perhaps fish.

The British generally have lunch at about one o'clock. The business man in London usually finds it impossible to come home for lunch, and so he goes to a café or a restaurant. But being at home he/she has cold meat (left over probably from yesterday's dinner), potatoes, salad and pickles, with a pudding or fruit to follow. Sometimes they have a mutton chop, or steak and chips. Some people like a glass of light beer with lunch.

Afternoon tea, you can hardly call a meal, but it is a sociable sort of thing between five and six o'clock, as friends often come in then for a chat while they have their cup of tea, cake or biscuit. But sometimes the English have ham or tongue and tomatoes and salad, or a kipper, or tinned salmon, or sausages, with good strong tea, plenty of bread and butter, then stewed fruit, or a tin of pears, apricots or pineapple with cream or custard and pastries or a good cake. That's they call a good tea.

In some houses dinner is the biggest meal of the day. The British begin with soup, followed by fish, roast chicken, potatoes and vegetables, a sweet, fruit and nuts. Then they have some coffee or tea.

But in many English homes they have the midday meal the chief one of the day. In the evening, they have much simpler supper — an omelette, or sausages, sometimes bacon and just bread and cheese, a cup of coffee or cocoa and fruit.

In recent years, foreign foods have become a regular part of the British diet. Indian, Italian and Chinese dishes are particularly popular for evening meals. Most supermarkets sell a lot of meals to be heated in the microwave.

Take-aways became extremely popular in the 1980s. The traditional British take-away are fish and chips with salt and vinegar. Most towns and cities now offer a wide variety of take-away meals, from American style hamburgers to Turkish kebabs. Many families prefer to eat take-away food for dinner instead of cooking.

B. American and Russian Food

Americans are fond of the Pizza, a dish brought from Europe, mainly from Italy. In the United States pizza has become the nation's favourite snack food.

They also prefer nuts, beef, potatoes, ice-cream and juicy fruits. Beef and potato meals are very popular all over the country. Ice-cream packed large can <u>be seen</u> even in kindergartens. Fresh fruit can <u>be bought</u> everywhere cheaply. Americans tend to eat in a place they find comfortable: in a car, a park, a forest, a field. They gladly eat food in standing or lying position.

In Russia food consumption centres on table gatherings. And the food people eat in the country is just the same as everywhere else in the world.

Russians like to cook and treat their guests. Usually there are 3 courses to a Russian dinner. For the first course Russian people used to have soup. There are many kinds of soup: cabbage soup, beetroot soup with sour cream, rice soup with meat and potatoes, clear soup with a meat pie, chicken broth, noodle soup, pea soup, fish soup, and bean soup.

Fried, roasted or boiled meat, cutlets, beefsteaks, meat dumplings, chicken, goose, duck with potatoes go for the second course. If you are a vegetarian, fried, boiled or mashed potatoes, salads, buckwheat, rice, boiled or stewed vegetables, pancakes with sour cream will be prepared for you.

For dessert Russians usually take stewed fruit, tea with lemon and sugar, which is called Russian tea, white or black coffee with cakes, chocolates, pies, ice-cream or fruits. You'll never leave a Russian table feeling hungry.

C. The Usual Way to Lay the Table

First spread the table-cloth and put out table-mats to protect the table from hot plates and dishes — a small mat for each person and larger ones for the hot dishes.

Put knives and soup spoons on the right-hand side and the forks on the left, except the pudding spoon and fork, which you should put across the top.

On the left of each guest put a small plate for bread and on the right a wine glass if you are going to have wine, and in the middle of the table put a jug of water with a few pieces of ice from the refrigerator in it. Then put out the table napkins for each guest, put the coffee cups and saucers, with cream and brown sugar and coffee spoons on the tray, and be ready for the guests to come in.



Hilton

This three-month-old restaurant has attracted attention because it is a restored, one hundred fifty-year-old, mill. The decor is charming and warm in an Early American, country style. Although the tables and chairs are modern reproductions, there are enough authentic antique pieces at the entrance and on the walls to avoid the fake Disneyland look of some restorations.

The menu is also very American, though it is a bit too traditional for my taste. The menu also is very extensive, which always worries me because a large menu often means a large freezer. Although my dinner companions and I chose some things from the regular menu, we usually chose one of the day's specials.

The most delicious main course we tried was the country stew which consisted of potatoes, carrots, peas, mushrooms, very tender beef, and — surprise! — some smoked pork sausage. Because top quality beef was used, it was unusually good. Among other well-prepared main courses was the fried chicken because it wasn't cooked before and then re-heated. It was fresh and crisp.

Because the main courses are so large, there is really no need for an appetizer or soup. But for big eaters I can recommend the mixed salad. The clam chowder was tasty because it was home-made but it had no special distinction. The oysters on the half-shell were nicely served on a bed of ice, although I would prefer to have a better sauce for them.

If you can still eat dessert after all this plus rather good homemade bread and creamery butter, try the apple pie. The apples were juicy and firm and the pastry was light.

It's hard to judge the service at this friendly restaurant. Because it was so crowded when I went, usually at 8 o'clock service was slow. The Reservation system doesn't always work. On one occasion, someone took our reservation for dinner but didn't have it when we arrived. This kind of thing can damage a restaurant's reputation, although its food may be good.

Feeling Unwell

There are certain laws of keeping health which are so simple that even a little child can learn them. Fresh air is very important to good health, perfect cleanliness is also essential. Every room in the house, especially bedroom should be properly cleaned. The whole body should be washed regularly. Certain exercises are necessary to keep fit. The old and the young should do morning exercises. Rest is also important to the health of both body and mind. Plenty of food rich in vitamins is indispensable for our health as well.

If one of these rules is broken, we may fall ill. The public health system has a variety of medical institutions. There are polyclinics, hospitals, dispensaries, and some other medical institutions in our country. The principle of our public health protection is the prevention of a disease. It is a matter of concern not only for doctors, but for the entire society.

Last winter I fell ill. I caught a cold. I felt sick and giddy. I had a bad cough and was running a high temperature. I had also a cold in my head and a terrible sore throat. It hurt me when I swallowed. It was clear that I needed a doctor's aid.

The doctor told me to stay in bed for a week to avoid complications after the illness. Then she prescribed me some pills, drops and a mixture. I was to take a table-spoonful of mixture twice a day, three pills a day after meals and some drops of medicine into my nose. Then my mother went to the chemist's to have the prescription made up. I followed all the doctor's directions.

In a week or so I felt much better. At the end of the week I went to the polyclinic where I had my chest X-rayed and my blood tested. Everything was all right. I recovered. The doctor gave me a sicknote and said that I could attend classes.

A. Shopping

Shops play an important role in our life, because everything we have, everything we eat and wear we buy in the shops.

As a rule, to buy food is my duty, although my mother always buys bread and milk because when she returns home from the work she walks past the baker's and the dairy shop. My father likes *rye*-

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bread, other members like white bread, but for me it is all the same what bread to eat. When we're run out of sugar, salt or some other food products I go to the provision shop with a great choice of food. The customers are served by salesgirls who stand behind the counter. The salesgirl weighs out foodstuffs and the cashier takes the money. On the counter I can see the assortment of all food products and choose what I need. As a rule, in the middle of the shop there is a cash desk where I pay for my purchases.

So we buy bread at the baker's, sugar, salt, tea, coffee, bacon, sausage, cheese at the grocer's, meat at the butcher's, vegetables at the greengrocer's, milk at the dairy. Sweets, cakes, biscuits are sold at the confectionery.

But I must say that I hate to stand in long queues. It is a waste of time for me. I prefer to go to the self-service shops. Everything is sold ready packed there. There are no shop assistants there, but only cashiers. You choose what you need and pay money at the cash desk.

Once a month my father and I go to the market where meet to buy and sell goods. Here all kinds of things for sale are combined. We prefer to go there because meat, vegetables and fish have more reasonable prices, and we also can *haggle* with the sellers. Besides, there are very many *booths* where we can buy beer, *cud*, pop-corn, and many other tasty things.

There is another shop that we always visit. It is a department store where we can buy different things: linen, stationery, fabrics, hosiery, crockery, leather goods. It is a big shop, many-storied as a rule, with different departments. Here you can also buy sport goods, household goods, musical instruments, TV sets, CD and DVD players, cameras and what not there.

My mother likes to go to the department with cosmetics and *jewelry*. My father likes *electric appliances*, so you can guess what department he likes.

As for me, the ready-made-clothes department is my favourite one. I go there very often, as I like the clothes that are of the latest fashion. A good assistant can help you a lot. She will show you the goods and advise a thing that suits you. There are special boxes in ready-made clothes departments where you can try any article of clothing, for clothes should fit a person perfect, but not too loose or tight.

Shopping

When we want to buy something, we go to a shop. There are many kinds of shops in every town or city, but most of them have a food supermarket, a department store, men's and women's clothing stores, grocery, a bakery, and a butchery.

I like to do my shopping at big department stores and supermarkets. They sell various goods under one roof and this is very convenient. A department store, for example, true to its name, is composed of many departments: ready-made clothes, fabrics, shoes, sports goods, toys, china and glass, electric appliances, cosmetics, linen, curtains, cameras, records, etc. You can buy everything you like there.

There are also escalators in big stores which take customers to different floors. The things for sale are on the counters so that they can be easily seen. In the women's clothing department, you can find dresses, costumes, blouses, skirts, coats, beautiful underwear,

and many other things. In the men's clothing department, you can choose suits, trousers, overcoats, ties, etc.

In the knitwear department, one can buy sweaters, cardigans, short-sleeved and long-sleeved pullovers, woollen jackets. In the perfumery, they sell face cream and powder, lipstick, lotions and shampoos.

In a food supermarket we can also buy many different things at once: sausages, fish, sugar, macaroni, flour, cereals, and tea. At the butcher's, there is a wide choice of meat and poultry. At the bakery, you buy brown and white bread, rolls, and biscuits.

Another shop we frequently go to is the greengrocery which is stocked by cabbage, potatoes, onions, cucumbers, carrots, beetroots, green peas and what not. Everything is sold here ready-weighed and packed. If you call round at a dairy, you can buy milk, cream, cheese, butter, and many other products.

The methods of shopping may vary. It may be a self-service shop where the customer goes from counter to counter selecting and putting into a basket what he wishes to buy. Then he takes the basket to the check-out counter, where the prices of the purchases are added up. If it is not a self-service shop, and most small shops are not, the shop-assistant helps the customer in finding what he wants. You pay money to the cashier, and he gives you back the change.

What is Shopping?

What is shopping? For most men, it is an ordeal, they can hardly bear more than twenty minutes in any shop and prefer doing any kind of hard work to accompanying their wives or girlfriends in a boutique or a supermarket. For women, shopping for clothes, toiletries or jewelries is a kind of entertainment, they can spend hours choosing a T-shirt or a pair of shoes, trying them on or even window-shopping.

A few years ago, we had no idea of what a mall is, they were associated with the USA or Western Europe. Now, we have lots of huge shopping centers in Russia.

Modern technology affects people's lifestyles and daily routine. Now, we can do our shopping not only in stores or markets but also on the Internet. No doubt, shopping online is more convenient and less time consuming, but, on the other hand, buying clothes without trying them on or perfume without smelling it may not seem a good idea.

While Internet purchases seem to be the most advanced kind of shopping, flea markets attract more and more people. Lots of people go there in search of bargains. Period pieces in antique shops may cost a fortune while in a flea market one can buy unique thing dirt cheap. Some flea markets, like the one in Portobello Road in London or Jaffo in Israel have become tourist attractions so far. Back yard or garage sales are also a good way to buy a useful thing (household goods, toys, books, CDs) at a low price; unfortunately, they are not so popular in our country as, for example, in the USA.

Shopping can tell us a lot about any country and its culture. In the Near East, bargaining is a part of tradition and a kind of art. In Russia, we more often pay in cash while in Western Europe cards are more common and shoppers even get a discount if they pay in cash.

Shopping for food is less exciting but may be more essential. One can choose between small groceries and big food shops, chain stores and supermarkets. In contrast to small shops, they are more spacious and well laid out, with the goods arranged tidily and attractively on long lines of shelves and in refrigerator units. A bewildering multitude of signs, posters and advertising displays draw the attention of customers to this or that product or "special offer". Because of their big size, big stores are able to offer a much wider selection of good than their small competitors and at a lower price. So they are large, efficient, well organized and modern but at the same time somewhat soulless and impersonal. Nevertheless, very few people feel nostalgic about the time when there were neither supermarkets nor food on the shelves.

A. Bashkortostan

The Republic of Bashkortostan was established on March 23, 1919. And as a sovereign republic within the Russian Federation it was proclaimed on *October 11, 1990*. The Head of State and the top official is the President. The supreme body of the legislative and representative branch is the bicameral State Assembly — Kurultai. The highest executive organ is the Cabinet of Ministers of the Republic of Bashkortostan.

Bashkortostan is located in the mountains and plains of the Southern Ural. Its territory is 143.600 square kilometres, and the population is over 4 million people. About a hundred nationalities inhabit Bashkortostan: Bashkirs, Russians, Tatars, Chuvashes, Maris, Ukrainians, Germans and others.

There are 21 cities and towns in Bashkortostan, the largest are Ufa, Sterlitamak, Salavat, Neftekamsk, Oktyabrskiy.

According to the natural conditions the territory of Bashkortostan can be divided into 3 parts: western, mountainous and Bashkir Trans-Urals. The western part is located upon the Russian plain. It's most favorable for life and business activities. It is here that the majority of the population live.

Bashkortostan's climate is continental. Here summers are warm, sometimes hot, and winters are cold and snowy. Bashkortostan is rich in animal life; native mammals include elk, wild boar, and roe deer. Wolves, foxes, bears, racoons, badgers, martens, polecats, lynxes, otters, and weasels are also to be found. Native rodents include beavers, hamster, marmots, squirrels, rats, mice, susliks, and chipmunks.

Bashkortostan is rich in woods. More than one third of the territory of Bashkortostan is covered with woods. The following types of trees dominate: birch tree, conifers, oak, maple, and *lime*. The Republic possesses nearly a third of all lime-tree forests of Russia. It is the lime-tree that makes Bashkir honey world famous.

The traditional Bashkir occupations of stock raising and beekeeping remain important economic activities. Bashkortostan is also famous for its koumiss healing centers.

Currently the Republic of Bashkortostan is the subject of the Russian Federation with versatile network of educational establishments. 12 higher educational establishments operate in the republic as well as 16 branches of leading Russian universities and colleges. Their graduates are specialists in about 200 trades and professions.

B. Industry of Bashkortostan

Bashkortostan has many modern industries, and is known all over the world for its "black gold". Oil is both collected and refined within the republic.

It is the leading center for chemical and petrochemical industries. In all, there are about 200 oil and gas deposits throughout Bashkortostan. The largest oil refineries located in Ufa, Ishimbai and Salavat produce over 300 items ranging from synthetic rubber to polyethylene and fertilizers and various brands of petrol, kerosene, diesel fuel, mineral oil, coke and bitumen.

Engineering is another key sector, composed of oil and chemical, machine-building, machine-tool building and vehicle construction. Sterlitamak, the second largest city after Ufa and one of the main centres of oil development, is home to several large chemical production facilities. Using salt and oil as raw materials they produce premium quality caustic soda, vinyl chloride resins, pesticides, thinners, and other products.

Bashkortostan ranks the second place in the Ural region as manufacturing centre. A variety of heavy industries on that resource base was built.

Bashkortostan has rich deposits of iron, with over 70 million tons discovered, as well as deposits containing zinc, aluminium, chromium, sulphur, silver, cobalt, cadmium, gallium, germanium, manganese, and salt. They also include brown coal and construction stone and a number of other rare elements in industrial quantities numbering over three thousand.

Bashkortostan has a developing non-ferrous industry which is represented by enterprises extracting and dressing copper ores and gold.

The Republic has a growing textile industry which includes cotton and wool fabrics, natural and artificial leather, clothes, footwear and knitted goods.

The forestry and timber processing industries are also being developed in Bashkortostan. Forests cover 39 % of the territory. The leading timber types include: birch (25 %), conifers (20 %), lime (17 %), oak (10 %) and maple (5 %).

The food industry is composed of four large sugar mills, a number of meat, tinned meat and dairy plants, and other factories producing beer, spirits, soft drinks, and mineral water.

C. Historical Survey

The earliest traces of ancient people on the territory of the Republic date as far as the Stone Age, the period marked by the use of primitive stone implements.

During the Bronze Age, people used tools and weapons made of bronze. Settled agriculture and farming were the main occupations of the local tribes. Those tribes also had different trades. But their descendants became nomadic cattle-breeders. That was in the 3d or 2nd millennium B.C.

The 4th century was the period when great numbers of nomadic tribes began to migrate to the territory of Western Bashkortostan from Southern steppes.

For the first time, the Bashkir people were mentioned in Arabic manuscripts of the 9th and 10th centuries. At that time, they inhabited the territory between the Volga and the Yaik. Some of them lived in the Urals. Their main occupations were nomadic cattlebreeding, hunting, fishing and apiculture.

The Bashkir people had been pagans until Islam came to them from Bulgaria situated on the Volga and the Kama area.

In 1229, the Mongolians invaded the territory of Bashkortostan. They had conquered it completely by 1236 and it became a part of the Golden Horde. But by the end of the 15th century after the disintegration of the Golden Horde Bashkortostan was divided into 3 parts each of which entered 3 different khanates: Kazan Khanate, Siberian Khanate and Nodal Horde.

But after Kazan had been seized and Kazan khanate liquidated, Russian tzar Ivan the Fourth (better known as Ivan the Terrible) addressed the Bashkir people and called upon them to reunite Russia and to pay the tribute to him. The tribe chiefs of the Bashkir people agreed to this.

Several decades later the Bashkirs from other khanates became Russian subjects too. So it is since the end of the 17th century that the Bashkir people have been Russian subjects.

D. National Bashkir Festivals and Feasts

There are lots of national holidays and feasts in Bashkortostan which date back to very old times.

One of the most popular is *the Sabantui* (The festival of the plough). It is an annual holiday originally devoted to the beginning

of agricultural works and celebrated in spring. On a week end, the inhabitants from the neighbourhood assemble on a big field not far from one of the villages.

At sunrise, children pass the yards of the village and gather gifts, towels, kerchiefs and what not as prizes for the Sabantui.

Ages ago this festival used to begin with a prayer followed by horse races around a big hill to symbolize the motion of the sun along the vault of heaven. That was followed by the laying of the first furrow and sowing. That meant the impregnation of earth. The festival ended with different kinds of contests, round dances, games. The winners of all the contests were awarded by the youngest married woman to underline the unity of female nature with the fecundity of the soil.

After 1920s, the Sabantui became less influenced by the ritual activities. Nowadays it has become a civil festival. The Sabantui is celebrated after the end of all works on the fields as a summing up the results. Amateur actors, singers and dancers perform on the improvised scenes their talents, different kinds of competitions used to take place right on a big field. Besides traditional horse races and various forms of national wrestling (e.g. *Kuresh*) one can enjoy watching such contests as breaking pots blindfolded, wrestling with the help of full sacks while sitting on a log, getting out a coin from the bottom of the bucket full of milk.

The Sabantui is nation-wide popular festival now. It is celebrated both in the countryside and in big cities and towns.

Bashkir Religious holidays, which are significant days of the Moslem calendar, are observed in the Republic of Bashkortostan. The main are *Uraza-bairam*, *Kurban-bairam* and *Rajab-bairam*.

Wild-Hive Beekeeping

Bashkortostan is the only place in Russia, where people are still engaged in the ancient business of wild-hive beekeeping. This is the most ancient form of apiculture, when honey is gathered not at beegardens but on the trees! At that bees are kept in pine-tree hollows.

The first information about Bashkir apiculture is known from the XVII century and the peak of wild-hive beekeeping falls on the XVIII-XIX centuries. Bashkirs kept their own hollows with bees and every bee master had its own sign ("tamga") on his hollows. The hollows were gouged out in trees at the height of 6-8 meters and 60-90 cm in diameter. Every bee family in such hollows had 2-5 swarms. Strong bee-families are able to bring up to 10-12 kg of honey per day. Because of intensive tree-felling and development of agriculture and cattle-breeding wild-hive beekeeping lost its meaning and gave way to modern bee-keeping. In order to preserve and investigate wild bees the Shulgan-Tash state reserve was established in 1986 in Bashkortostan.




Wild-hive beekeeping is still alive in Burziansky region of Bash-kortostan. Being nearly completely dead in 50s last century, wild-hive beekeeping began to revive among local population again. There are several reasons to that: people begin to understand growing significance of natural foods and honey undoubtedly belongs to such products. Not with standing all forecasts, wild-hive beekeeping is becoming economically profitable. This honey has no analogues in the world on its medicinal and tasting properties. Wild honey possesses a unique delicate aroma and taste. This honey is saturated with beeswax and ambrosia and is rich with fructose and glucose. Its composition includes ferments and vitamins, about twenty amino acids and mineral aromatic substances. In Ufa there is a special monument to the Bee.

Ufa

Ufa is the capital of Bashkortostan, its area is 710.16 km² and the population numbers 1,021,500 inhabitants (in 2008). Ufa began as a fortress, built on the order of Ivan IV in 1574. Originally it bore the name of the hill it stood on, Tura-Tau. It got the town status in 1586. The city began to be called Ufa, meaning "small" in Turkic, by locals, and the name stuck. In 1802, Ufa became the principal city of Bashkortostan.



The city is situated at the confluence of the rivers Aghidel (Belaya) and the Ufa. When you arrive in Ufa by train or boat, the first thing you see is the monument to the national hero, Salavat Yulaev, which is on the right bank of the river Aghidel. It was built in 1967. Next to it there is a little view point. You can see

picturesque embankment and the bridges across the river, near and distant hills, on one of which stands the Monument to Friendship erected in honour of Bashkiria's voluntary joining the Russian State.

The lives of many outstanding people are connected with Ufa. The Russian singer, Fyodor Shalyapin (1873-1938), lived in Ufa and gave his first performance there. The Russian ballet dancer, Rudolf Nuriev (1938-1993), started his career in Ufa. The Russian painter, Mikhail Nesterov (1862-1942), lived in the city and painted many of his works there. In fact, the city's State Art Gallery is named after him. Similarly one of the streets in Ufa is Aksakov Street is named after Sergey Aksakov (1791-1859), a famous Russian writer who grew up and lived for some time in Ufa.

Our contemporary famous fellow-citizens who lived in Ufa include the world-wide known conductor and musician Vladimir Spivakov, pianist Vera Timanova, NHL ice hockey players Andrei Zyuzin, Alexandr Semak and Igor Kravchuk. Rock singer Yuriy Shevchuk and his band DDT were Ufa residents as well as Zemfira.

Ufa is also famous for its theatres: the Bashkir State Opera and Ballet House, the Republican Bashkir Drama Theatre, the Republican Russian Drama Theatre, the Bashkir State Puppet Theatre and the Youth Theatre. Besides there is a National Symphony Orchestra, "Bashkortostan" film studio, thirty philharmonic collectives, and the Bashkir State Folk Dance Ensemble.

Educational institutions include Bashkir State University, Bashkir State Teachers Training University named after M. Akmulla, State Aviation Technical University, State Petroleum Technological University, State Agricultural University, State Art University, some branches of Moscow universities and many vocational and technical schools.

The Ufa Airport connects the city to several cities in Russia, as well as to Armenia, Azerbaijan, Germany, Turkey and Uzbekistan.


Ufa is one of the industrial centres in the Western Ural area. Industries include electrical and mining equipment, oil refining, petrochemicals, synthetic rubber, and processed foods.

Salavat Yulaev Monument in Ufa

The monument of Salavat Yulaev — national Bashkir hero and poet — was erected in 1967. This is the biggest horse statue in Russia, nearly ten meters high, weighing 40 tons. It is considered the best work of Soslanbeck Tavasiev, sculptor, who has been working

over the monument during 30 years. It is known that Salavat Yulaev with his squadron was sent to support governmental troops, which were directed to defeat Pugatchev. But Salavat Yulaev decided to join Pugatchev and thus to support the national rebel.



The sculpture was cast in Leningrad at the plant "Monumentsculpture" and bronzed cast iron was used as the main material. The monument was being cast during three months. On November 17, 1967, the monument to Salavat Yulaev was solemnly opened and three months later its author was rewarded with the State Prize of the USSR. The monument has become one of the best places of interest in Ufa, a national treasure of the Republic. It is not accidentally that the monument of the national hero RB became the central element on the emblem of Bashkortostan.



A. Means of Travelling

Modern life is impossible without travelling. True, we often get tired of the same surroundings and daily routine. Hence some relaxation is essential to restore our mental and physical resources. That is why the best place of relaxation, in my opinion, is the one where you have never been before. And it is by means of travelling that you get to that place.

To understand how true it is you've got to go to a railway station, a sea or a river port or an airport. There you are most likely to see hundreds of people hurrying to board a train, a ship or a plane.

Travelling by train is slower than by plane, but it has its advantages. You can see the country you are travelling through and enjoy the beautiful nature. It may be an express train or a passenger one. There is no doubt it's much more convenient to travel by an express train because it does not stop at small stations and it takes you less time to get to your destination.

But if you are in a hurry and want to save your time, you'd better travel by plane because it is the fastest way of travelling. After the procedure of registration, you board the plane at last. You sit down in comfortable armchair and in a few minutes you are already above the clouds. After the plane gained, its regular height the stewardess brings in some mineral water. You can sit and read a book or a magazine, look through the window to watch the passing clouds change their color from white to black.

Some people prefer to travel by ship when possible. A sea voyage is very enjoyable, indeed. But to my mind, the best way of travelling is by car. And for this reason travelling by car is popular for pleasure trips while people usually take a train or a plane when they are travelling on business.

When you get tired of relaxation, you become home-sick and feel like returning home. You realize that "East or West — home is best", as the saying goes.

A. The Russian Federation

The Russian Federation is the largest country in the world. It occupies about one-seventh of the earth's surface. It covers the eastern part of Europe and the northern part of Asia. Its total area is about 17 million square kilometres. The country is washed by 12 seas of 3 oceans: the Pacific, the Arctic and the Atlantic. In the south, Russia borders on China, Mongolia, Korea, Kazakhstan, Georgia, and Azerbaijan. In the west it borders on Norway, Finland, the Baltic States, Belarus and Ukraine. It also has a sea-border with the USA.

There is hardly a country in the world where such a variety of scenery and vegetation can be found. There are steppes in the south, plains and forests in the midland, tundra and taiga in the north, highlands and deserts in the east.

There are two great plains in Russia: the Great Russian Plain and the West Siberian Lowland. There are several mountain chains on the territory of the country: the Urals, the Caucasus, the Altai, and others. The largest mountain chain, the Urals, separates Europe from Asia.

There are over two million rivers in Russia. Europe's biggest river, the Volga, flows into the Caspian Sea. The main Siberian rivers — the Ob, the Yenisei and the Lena — flow from the south to the north. The Amur in the Far East flows into the Pacific Ocean. Russia is rich in beautiful lakes. The world's deepest lake (1,600 metres) is Lake Baikal. The water in the lake is so clear that if you look down you can see the stones on the bottom.

Russia has one-sixth of the world's forests. They are concentrated in the European north of the country, in Siberia and in the Far East.

On the vast territory of the country there are various types of climate, from arctic in the north to subtropical in the south. In the middle of the country the climate is temperate and continental.

Russia is rich in oil, coal, iron ore, natural gas, copper, nickel and other mineral resources.

Russia is a parliamentary republic. The Head of State is the President. The legislative power is exercised by the Duma. The capital of Russia is Moscow. It is its largest political, scientific, cultural and industrial centre. It is one of the oldest Russian cities. Today there are a lot of opportunities for this country to become one of the leading countries in the world. It has great past and promising future.

B. Moscow


The population of Moscow the capital of Russian Federation is about 9 million people. Its total area is about 900 thousand square kilometres.

Moscow was founded by the Prince Yuri Dolgoruki in 1147. It appeared as a fortress and was a small town with the Kremlin in the centre. Since 1918, it has been the capital in our country. Red Square and the Kremlin are still the heart of Moscow. It is a historic city which played an important role in the history of the country.

Moscow is the seat of the Russian Government, an important industrial centre of the country. Plants and the factories of the capital produce machinery, motor cars, steel and other goods.

Moscow is a city of students. There are several universities, lots of Institutes and schools of different types in it. The Academy of Sciences of Russia is situated in the capital.

Moscow is also the largest cultural center of the country. There are more than 80 museums, many theatres and libraries. The largest museums are the Pushkin Museum of Fine Arts and the state Tretyakov Gallery. The Pushkin Museum of Fine Arts is among the world's outstanding museums. Its collections contain works of ancient and modern art, paintings and sculptures of different national schools of Europe and America. The Pushkin Museum of Fine Arts is a remarkable depository of world art. It is the pride of Moscow and Russia. The Gallery was founded by Pavel Tretyakov, a rich Moscow merchant. He presented his collection of pictures to the city of Moscow in 1892. Almost all famous Russian painters are represented there.



The Spasskaya Tower is the symbol of Russia and Moscow. It was built in 1491 and got its name from icon of the Saviour that formerly hung above the tower gate. The tower is famous for its clock. Granovitaya Chamber is another masterpiece inside the Kremlin wall. Moscow tsars held magnificent receptions in honour of foreign ambassadors there. The Granovitaya Chamber is connected with the enormous Grand Kremlin Palace.

Moscow's theatres are famous all over the world. The best known of them is the Bolshoi Theatre.

Moscow is a beautiful, green city of about 1000 parks. Moscow is a great transport centre. There are five airports, nine railway stations and two river ports. Moscovites and guests of the capital like to go by the Metro. Some of its stations are well-known for their beauty.


The most popular means of transport for locals and visitors is the metro. The Moscow metro is very fast. It has more than 170 stations around the city and it is always very busy. Seven million passengers use it every day from 6 a.m. to 1 a.m. Passengers can tell where a train goes from the voice of the announcers. All trains that go to the centre have a male voice and trains that go away from the centre have a female voice.

The metro goes to major sights. The Station Ploshchad Revolutsii takes you to the Cremlin and Red Square. The metro station Teatralnaya is near the Bolshoi and Maly Treatres.

But the metro is also an attraction in itself. People call it "The Underground Palace" because many stations are really beautiful with mosaic ceilings, wonderful chandeliers, graceful sculptures and brilliant paintings.

C. Saint Petersburg

Saint Petersburg is the second largest city after Moscow. It was founded in 1703 by Peter I. In 1712, it became the capital of the country.



Saint Petersburg is one of the largest industrial, cultural, scientific centres in Russia. Many plants, famous all over the country are in the city. Among them are the Kirov Tractor Plant, "Electrosila", the chemical plant "Krasny Treugolnik", the shoe factory "Skorokhod" and others. Saint Petersburg is a sea port which welcomes ships from many European countries.

When we speak about Saint Petersburg as the greatest scientific centre, we must remember that Russian Academy of Sciences was organized there in 1725. First Russian academies were founded in the 18th century. Saint Petersburg is still a city of students.

Saint Petersburg is a city of fascinating museums. The first museum to be mentioned is the Kunstcamera founded by Peter I. It will take you much time to visit all the museums. The Hermitage, the Russian Museum, the Navy Museum, the Summer Palace of Peter I, Saint Peter and Paul's Fortress, and others. Saint Petersburg is one of the most beautiful cities in the world. Masterpieces of art by Falconet, Rastrelli, Voronikhin, Klodt have gained world fame.

The first sights that numerous tourists, arriving in St. Petersburg, are anxious to see, are the monument to Peter I, the Alexander Column, the Anichkov Bridge, the Kazan Cathedral, the Great Palace in Peterhof.

The city with its elegant avenues, its bridges, the Summer Garden with fine sculptures inspired many poets, composers, painters. And all these masterpieces of the 18th and 19th centuries architecture were almost ruined during the World War II. The city was completely encircled by navy forces on September 8,1941. Lake Ladoga was the only link with the rest of the country. The blockade lasted 900 days. All the hardships did not break the spirit of the Leningraders. And the people won.

There is one place in Saint Petersburg which is sacred to all the citizens. This is the Piskarev Cemetery. The heroic defenders of the city and people who died in the frozen city were buried there.

* * *

The city is situated on islands formed by the Neva, the Fontanka, the Moika and other rivers and channels. More than 300 bridges connect these islands. Over 30 bridges are real pieces of art. This is the reason why people often say that beautiful city with 90 waterway, 42 islands and 300 bridges is the "Venice of the North".

Every summer from June until July something wonderful happens in St. Petersburg. It is a wonder of nature that Russians call the "White Nights". Visitors from all over the world travel to the city to see this phenomenon. During the White Nights the sun does not set

completely and a silver glow fills the sky. This sight attracts tourists and locals who go out to the streets to enjoy it and celebrate. People sing and dance by the Neva River. They watch the bridges open as boats pass by and fireworks fill the sky.

D. From the History of Russia (Catherine the Great)

Amazingly Catherine the Great is considered to be one of the most outstanding women in Russia though more than 200 years have passed since she reigned (1762-1796).

Princess Sophie Fredericke Auguste was born in Stettin, Germany in 1729. In 1744, Sophie arrived in Moscow to meet Elizabeth I of Russia, daughter of Peter the Great, as bride to the heir (наследник) of the future Russian throne, Peter III. She adopted the Orthodox religion and became Ekaterina Alekseevna, and in 1761 married Peter III, who was crowned Emperor of Russia. But he proved to be an unintelligent and inefficient ruler. In 1762, Catherine, supported by the Imperial guards, overthrew (свергла) Peter and became Catherine II.

She worked extremely hard to master the Russian language, customs and traditions. Throughout her life, she kept saying, "I'm more Russian than some who say they are."

Catherine the Great, who was also called *The Gatherer of Russian Lands*, added 200,000 square miles to Russia's territory. In two wars against Turkey, Russia gained the Crimea and the coast around the Black Sea. In fact, Catherine gave Russia the right of free trade there. After Peter the Great's "Window to Europe" in the Baltic Sea, this was a huge achievement. Catherine made Russia the largest and most powerful state to confront Turkey for their domination (господство) of the former Byzantian countries (Greece, Serbia, Romania) in Europe.

A. Education in Russia

System of Education in Russian Federation

There are two stages of school education in Russia: primary education and secondary education.

At the age of 6 or 7 Russian children go to school.

During the first three or four years, they get a primary education: they learn to read, write, count, and draw. They also have lessons of music, physical training and handicrafts. In Russia, primary schools are not separated from secondary schools: we have large schools which combine a primary and a secondary education.

The course of secondary education is, in its turn, subdivided into two stages: the first stage, which might be called intermediate, and the senior stage.

The intermediate stage is compulsory and embraces classes from the 5th one to the 9th one. During the intermediate stage the pupils get a basic knowledge in the Russian language and literature, a foreign language, mathematics, physics, chemistry, history, geography, biology. They also have lessons of music, art, and handicrafts. A computer course is also included in the curriculum.

On completing the intermediate course of studies, at the age of 14, the pupils may either go to vocational or technical schools, which give a professional training, or stay on at the secondary school for another two years. The curriculum of the last two years offers a wide range of subjects, so that teenagers can choose a course of studies, according to their individual inclinations and abilities.

After finishing school, one can either become a worker or enter any institution of higher learning. There are universities and so called institutes in Russia. The former stress a more theoretical, fundamental approach to education, while the latter are more practically oriented.

To be admitted to an institution of higher learning, one has to pass a series of oral and written tests. Grades in the certificate of secondary education are also taken into the account. Entry to higher education is quite competitive.

Education in Russia has until recently been free on all levels. College students with good grades were rewarded with a modest stipend. All institutions of higher learning were subsidized by the government. Now the system of education is bound to undergo profound changes. The first private schools, gymnasiums and lyceums have already been founded in many towns.

From the History of Bashkir State Pedagogical University (BSPU) named after M. Akmulla

BSPU named after Miftahetdin Akmulla was established in Ufa on January 9, 1967 as an Institute. The first Teacher's Institute in the Republic was established in 1909. Since 1919, it was transformed into the Institute of Public Education, which consisted of four faculties: Sociohistorical, Biology and Geography, Physics and Mathematics, and Literary and Linguistic. This higher educational institution trained teachers of schools and technical schools.


Since 1923, the Institute has received the name "Practical" and began to prepare additional experts of agriculture.

In 1929, the Bashkir State Pedagogical Institute named after Timiryazev was created on its base. Later, in 1957, it was transformed into the Bashkir State University.

However, the need for the higher pedagogical education development and high-skilled teachers was high. By that time, less than a third of the republic's teachers had higher education. In many specialties there was no training at all. The newly created Bashkir State Pedagogical Institute (BSPI) successfully coped with this task.

In 1976, it was recognized as a first-class institution. And in 2000, BSPI was renamed the Bashkir State Pedagogical University. In 2006, it was named after M. Akmulla.

Today the Bashkir State Pedagogical University named after M. Akmullah include 5 institutes, 7 faculties, and 43 departments. They are: Institute of Historical and Legal Education; Institute of Philological Education and Intercultural Communications; Institute of Professional Education and Information Technologies; Institute of Pedagogy; Institute for Advanced Studies and Professional Retraining; Art and Graphic Faculty; Psychology Faculty; Faculty of Physics and Mathematics; Faculty of Natural and Geographical Sciences; Faculty of Physical Education; Faculty of Bashkir Philology; Faculty of Social and Humanities; College of BSPU.



B. Education Abroad

Education in Great Britain

Education in Great Britain is provided by the Local Education Authority (LEA) in each county. Until recently, each LEA was free to decide how to organize education in its own area. However, in 1988 the "National Curriculum" was introduced. It means that there is greater government control over what is taught in schools now.

Children under five don't have to go to school. The places are usually given to families in special circumstances, for example, families with one parent only. That's why in many areas parents have formed play groups where children under five can go for a morning or afternoon a couple of times a week.

At the age of five, children go to primary schools, first to infant schools for pupils aged from 5 to 7 and then to junior schools for pupils from 8 to 11.

Some parents choose to pay for private education though there are free State schools. Private schools are called by different names compared to State schools. The preparatory schools are for pupils aged up to 13, and the public schools are for 13 to 18 year-olds. Free secondary education has been available to all children in Britain since 1944. Children must go to school until the age of 16, and pupils may stay on for one or two years more if they wish.

Over 80 per cent of schoolchildren go to comprehensive schools at the age of 11. Comprehensive schools want to develop the talents of each individual child. So they offer a wide choice of subjects, from art and craft, woodwork and domestic science to the sciences, modern languages, computer studies, etc. All these subjects are attended by both girls and boys. All pupils move to the next class automatically at the end of the year.

At the age of 14 or 15, pupils begin to choose their exam subjects. In 1988, a new public examination — the General Certificate of Secondary Education (GCSE) — was introduced for 16 year-olds. This examination assesses pupils on the work they do in the 4th and 5th year at secondary school. For university entrance pupils have to take A-Level (Advanced Level) on GCE exam.

Many people decide to leave school at the age of 16 and go to a Further Education (FE) College for practical vocational training, for example, in engineering, typing, cooking, or hairdressing.

Education in the United States

American education remains today what it was in the earliest days of the Republic. Its goal is universal education from kindergarten to university.

Education in the United States comprises three basic levels: elementary, secondary and higher education. Parents may choose whether to send their children to their local free public schools, or to private schools which charge fees. The organization and curricula of private schools and colleges are similar to those of public schools although the administration differs.

The vast majority of students at the primary and secondary levels go to public schools. Most of those who attend private schools attend church sponsored parochial [pəˈrəʊkjəl] schools (школы при церкви).

The school year is usually nine months long, from early September to mid-June. The common pattern of organization, referred to as the 6-3-3 plan, includes elementary school in grades 1 through 6, junior high school in grades 7 through 9 and senior high school in grades 10 through 12. However, many variations on the pattern exist in the USA.

The main purpose of elementary school is the general intellectual and social development of the child from 6 to 12 or 15 years of age.

In secondary schools most pupils follow a course that includes English, science, social studies, mathematics and physical education. Elective subjects may be chosen in the fields of foreign languages, fine arts and vocational training. Pupils usually elect about half their work in grades nine through twelve.

The vocational program may give training in four fields: agricultural education, business education, home economics and trade, and industrial education. This program prepares students either for employment or further training.

Most young Americans graduate from school with a high school diploma upon satisfactory completion of a specified number of courses. Students are usually graded from A (excellent) to F (failing) in each course they take on the basis of performance in tests given at intervals throughout the year.

Students receive "report cards" at least twice a year which indicate the grades they have received in each of the subjects. High schools maintain a school "transcript" which summarizes the courses taken and the grades obtained for each student.

Usually, the pupil has one teacher for all major subjects during his or her first six years of schooling. For the last six grades, however, they have a separate teacher for each discipline.

The US is committed to providing every youngster with a good, solid education, regardless of the economic background or even the inherent ability of the youngster.

The American people have accepted the view that the quality of education is directly related to the quality of life. It is part of the American tradition to presume that they can improve.

Education in Britain and America

Differences in the organization of education in Britain and America lead to different terms. One crucial word, school, is used in overlapping but different ways. A place of education for young children is a school in both varieties. But a public school in Britain is in fact a "private" school; it is a fee-paying school not controlled by the local education authority. The free local authority school in America is a public school. The American grade school has a BE near-equivalent of elementary school.

But whereas an American can say, "Standrod is a pretty good school," the word school in BE is never to refer to a university or other college of higher education. An American high school student graduates; a British secondary school pupil (never student) leaves school. To graduate is possible only from a university, polytechnic or college of education in British usage; graduating entails taking a degree. British universities have 3 terms; American universities have 2 semesters (or in some recent cases, 4 quarters). A British university student takes 3 years, in the typical case, to get his degree; these are known as the first, second and final years. The American university student typically takes 4 years, known as freshman, sophomore, junior and senior years.

While he is studying, the American majors in a particular subject, but also takes electives; the British student usually takes a main and a subsidiary subjects. The British term honours degree signifies that the student specializes in one main subject, perhaps with one subsidiary. The American student earns credits for successfully completing a number of self-contained courses of study, the credits eventually reaching the total needed for him to receive a degree. There is no counterpart to the credit system in British high education at present.

The British student who has already taken a first degree (usually a B.A. or B.Sc. except in Scottish universities) is a post-graduate; the American equivalent is a graduate. In American universities those who teach are known as the faculty; in Britain they are the staff, possibly dignified as the academic staff.

BE has no equivalent to AE co-ed a girl student, nor is there any BE equivalent if the American sorority of fraternity, i.e. nation-wide university clubs or associations with membership.

A. Great Britain

The United Kingdom of Great Britain and Northern Ireland is situated on the British Isles. It consists of four parts: England, Wales, Scotland and Northern Ireland. England, Wales and Scotland occupy the territory of Great Britain.

The territory of the United Kingdom is about 244,000 square kilometres. The population is over 57 million people. About 80 % of the population is urban. The capital of the country is London.

The surface of Great Britain varies greatly. The northern and western part of the country is mountainous and is called the Highlands. All the rest (south, east, and centre) is a vast plain which is called the Lowlands. The mountains are not very high.

The rivers are not long in Britain. The largest of them are the Severn (350 km), the Clyde and the Mersey. They flow into the Irish Sea. The Thames (346 km), the Trent (274 km), the Ouse keep their way to the North Sea. The Thames is the busiest and the most important river in Great Britain. The capital of Great Britain, London, stands on the Thames.

The climate of Great Britain is mild due to the influence of the warm waters of the Gulf-Stream. The summers are usually cool and rainy. There is much rain and fog in autumn and in winter. Great Britain is a damp country. The weather is very changeable and it is the favourite topic of conversation in Britain.

Great Britain is a highly developed industrial country. It is known as one of the world's largest producers and exporters of iron and steel products, machinery and electronics, chemicals and textile, aircraft and navigation equipment. One of the chief industries of the country is shipbuilding.

Great Britain is a country with old cultural traditions and customs. The most famous educational centres are Oxford and Cambridge universities. They are considered to be the intellectual centres of Europe. The education is not free, it is very expensive.

Britain is a parliamentary democracy with a constitutional monarch. The present Sovereign is Queen Elizabeth II. Actually the Sovereign reigns but doesn't rule. The United Kingdom is governed by the Government — the Cabinet of Ministers. It consists of the leading members of the political party in power. They are responsible to Parliament. The main political parties are the Conservatives, the Labour Party and the Liberal-Social Democratic Party.

The Prime Minister, who heads the Government, is usually the leader of the party which has a majority in the House of Commons. The House of Commons and the House of Lords with the Monarch comprise the Parliament.

Great Britain is one of the world's major industrialised and trading nations. It enjoys a long established democratic system of government which has provided political stability. The United Kingdom is a member of the European Community (EC), the United Nations Organisation (UNO), the North Atlantic Treaty Organisation (NATO) and the Commonwealth.

B. London

London is the capital of England, the capital of Great Britain, and the capital of the United Kingdom. It is the largest town in Europe and one of the oldest towns in the world.

London is a very old city. It is more than twenty centuries old. London consists of many parts and each of them differ from each other. The most important parts of London are: the City, the West End, the East End, and Westminster.

The City is the oldest part of London. There are some famous ancient buildings within the City, such as Saint Paul's Cathedral. Londoners have a particular affection for Saint Paul's Cathedral, the largest Protestant Church in England. It is an architectural mas-

terpiece of the architect Sir Christopher Wren. The building was completed in 1710. Christopher Wren is buried under the roof of his own great work. "If you want to see his monument, look around," is written on his tomb.

The most fashionable part is the West End. It is situated between the City and Hyde Park. The best hotels, restaurants, clubs, theatres, cinemas and the richest shops are there. There are many beautiful concert halls in London. They are the Royal Opera House, the National Theatre and the Royal Albert Hall.



There are many parks in London. They are green corners of London. The people go to the parks, walk there and usually listen to the music in summer. One of the most popular parks is Hyde Park with the Speaker's Corner.

The Houses of Parliament, a symbol of London, is situated on the north bank of the Thames. This structure is a remarkable example of Gothic architecture. The well-known Clock Tower called "Big Ben". Its hour bell is named after Sir Benjamin Hall, the first Commissioner of Works. The Houses of Parliament, called officially the Palace of Westminster, were formally a palace for kings and queens. Until the 16th century it was used both as a royal residence and as a parliament house. After the royal family moved to Whitehall Palace, the Westminster Palace was occupied by the Parliament and became its permanent home.

The oldest of all the places in London is the Tower of London. The Tower of London is also a real attraction for tourists. It is one of the first and most impressive castles built after the Norman invasion of England in 1066. William the Conqueror built it to protect the City of London. The Tower has been used as a royal palace, an

observatory, a state prison where many famous people have been executed. It is now a museum. The security of the Tower is ensured by "Beefeaters" or the Yeoman Warders who still wear their picturesque Tudor uniform. A lot of ancient traditions and customs are carefully kept in the Tower.

Trafalgar Square is a place of pilgrimage for visitors. It's the natural centre of London. It is usually full of visitors feeding the pigeons and looking at the statues and fountains. In the middle of the square you can see Nelson's Column with the statue of Nelson at the top. This monument was erected to commemorate Nelson's victory at the Battle of Trafalgar in 1805 where he defeated the French and Spanish fleets. The pedestal of the Column is decorated with bas-reliefs representing Nelson's most famous victories. Here in Trafalgar Square the National Gallery is situated. It contains an outstanding collection of paintings.

From Trafalgar Square it is only a short way to Piccadilly Circus, meeting point of six streets, an advertizing and publicity centre.

In every part of London you can find a very genuine affection for national traditions.

A. The Geography of the USA

The United States is the fourth largest country in the world in size and population. It is situated in the central part of the North American continent. It occupies a large territory. It's washed by the Atlantic Ocean in the east and by the Pacific ocean in the west. It stretches from Canada in the North to Mexico, the Gulf of Mexico, and the Gulf of California in the south.

The USA is a federal republic, a union of 50 states. The capital of the country Washington is situated in a special federal area called the District of Columbia.

The population of the country is about 260 million people. They are the people of all races and nationalities, either descendants of immigrants or immigrants who have come to America from all the countries of the world in search of independence and self-realization.

The United States is a Land of rivers and lakes. The Northern state of Minnesota is a land of 10,000 lakes. The longest rivers in the USA are the Mississippi and the Rio Grande.

The West is a mountainous area of the Rocky Mountains, the Cordillera and the Sierra Nevada. As compared with the Appalachians in the east, the Rocky Mountains are sharp and rugged, over

4,000 metres high, rich in gold, copper, lead, silver and other minerals.

Among the largest cities of the USA are New York, Los Angeles, Chicago, Philadelphia, Detroit, San Francisco and others. But a great proportion of the country consists of open land marked with farm-houses and small towns.

The USA is one of the greatest industrial and loading agricultural nations in the world. With only about 5 % of the world's population and about 6 % of its land area, the USA produces around 25 % of the world's industrial products, agricultural goods and services. It's the world's leader in biochemical and genetic engineering, aerospace research and development, communications, computer and information services and similar high-technology fields.

B. Washington, DC

In 1790, the US congress decided to build the capital on the Potomac River along the Virginia-Maryland border. President Washington selected the area which was named the District of Columbia after Christopher Columbus.

Its population is a little over 600,000 people. Its only industry is government. All government departments and numerous federal institutions are in the capital. They are the White House, where the US president lives and works, the Capitol, the Home of the US Congress and the Supreme court.

The two centres are connected by Pensilvania Avenue, the main business street of the city. Washington has always been the scene of mass demonstrations, marches and rallies. Pensilvania Avenue is Washington's ceremonial street and the site of the president's inaugural day parade.

The second important aspect of the city's economy is tourism. The national monuments and museums attract more than 18 million visitors each year. The centre of Washington is formed by the Mall, the East Potomac and West Potomac parks. In this area you can see Vietnam Veterans Memorial, the Thomas Jefferson Memorial, the Lincoln Memorial, and the Washington monument.

Washington is a major American cultural centre. Not far from the Mall there are a number of important museums many of which are administrated by the Smithsonian Institution. Among them the National Gallery of Art, the Museum of American History, the national Museum of National History, the National Air and Space Museum., the National Museum of African Art and others. Overlooking the Potomac, there is the John F. Kennedy Centre for the Performing Arts, which was opened in 1971 as a memorial to President Kennedy. It is a centre for drama, opera, film and music. Other major theatres are Constitution Hall, the National Theatre, Warner Theatre and Ford's Theatre.

The majority of Universities in Washington are private, including Georgetown University, American University, George Washington University, the Catholic University of America, and Trinity College.

C. New York

New York is America's largest city. Many people call it the heart of America.

The students are encouraged to consider such questions as ethical judgement, political liberty and social control administration.

Undergraduates reading law for four years take L.L.B. degree. At the end of studies, the student writes his (or her) degree work, the theme being taken from International Law, Legal Law, Roman Law, Criminal Law, and other subjects. A candidate for the postgraduate L.L.M. degree submits a dissertation.

To become J.M. (Master of Jurisprudence) or J.S.D. (Doctor of Science of Law), more serious theoretical and practical work is needed. Many graduates of our university administer justice. They work as judges, investigators, lawyers. They discover many crimes and protect the rights and lawful interests of the citizens. You must remember that the better you study, the better you know the laws and the better you will help people.

Law Justice in Russia

The President of the Russian Federation is the Head of the State. The Parliament of the Russian Federation, consisting of two Chambers: The Federal Council and the State Duma, is the representative and legislative organ of the State. Members of both Chambers are elected for a term of 4 years. The highest executive and administrative body of the State is the Government of Russia. Courts of differ-

ent instances administer justice on the basis of the laws of the state. Law is a system of rules regulating relations in human society.

The basic Russian judicial organ is the District (city) People's Court. District courts try both criminal and civil cases. The district court examines a case and brings in a sentence or a decision. It is a court of first instance. The majority of the cases are heard by the District People's Courts, consisting of a judge and people's assessors having the rights of judges.

More serious cases such as crime against the state are heard by the regional court. The court of second instance examines appeals and protests against sentences and decisions of the courts of first instance. The Supreme Court is the highest judicial organ of the Russian State. It supervises the work of all judicial organs.

The Procurator's Office is exercising supervisory power to ensure the execution of law by all organizations, offices and citizens of the state. The participants in the trail are the prosecutor, the accused, the defendant, witnesses, the plaintiff, the jury. The jury decides if the accused is innocent or guilty.

Justice and Courts in the United Kingdom

The United Kingdom judiciary is entirely independent of the Government. There is no Minister of Justice. The Lord Chancellor is the head of the judiciary. Although the United Kingdom is a unitary State, England and Wales, Scotland and Northern Ireland have their own legal systems and law courts, and considerable differences remain in law, organization and practice. However, a large volume of modem legislation applies through the United Kingdom.

The main sources of law are legislation, common law and European Community law.

Legislation consists of Acts of Parliament, orders (rules and regulations made by ministers under the authority of an Acts of Parliament) and by laws, made by local government or other authorities exercising powers conferred by Parliament.

Common law, the ancient law of the land deduced from customs and interpreted in court cases by the judges, has never been precisely defined or codified but forms the basis of the law.

European Community law is confined mainly to economic and social matters. The legal system of the United Kingdom distinguishes between criminal and civil law.

The criminal law is concerned with wrongful acts harmful to the community.

The civil law is concerned with individuals' rights, duties and obligations towards one another.

British criminal justice comprises four stages:

- making laws which define illegal actions;
- preventing crime and enforcing the law, largely matters for the police;
- determining in the courts the guilt or innocence of the people accused of crimes and sentencing the guilty;
 - dealing with convicted offenders.

The criminal law is government-sponsored, but there is usually consultation between government departments and the legal profession, the police, probation and prison services and voluntary bodies. Crime statistics are published annually and further information about crime trends is contained in the annual reports of Her Majesty's Chief Inspector of Constabulary.

A wide range of research into criminal and social policies is carried out in university departments, much of it financed by the Government. The principal university criminological research establishment is the Institute of Criminology at Cambridge.

The civil law of England, Wales and Northern Ireland is subdivided into: family law, the law of property, the law of contract and the law of torts.

Other branches of the civil law include constitutional and administrative, industrial, maritime laws. Scottish civil law has its own, often analogous branches.

There are *Magistrates' Courts* and the Crown Courts in Britain. The courts of the United Kingdom are the Queen's Courts since the Crown is the historic source of all judicial power. The Queen, act-

ing on the advice of ministers, is responsible for all appointments to the judiciary.

Magistrates' courts deal with nearly all less criminal cases and conduct preliminary investigations into offences. Magistrates are sitting in courts without a jury.

The Crown Court deals with trials of more serious criminal cases and the trials are held before a jury. A jury is completely independent of the judiciary.

Classical Music

The term "classical music" was not used until the early 19th century. People then started talking about classical music in order to praise the great composers such as Bach, Mozart and Beethoven. In the 20th century many different ways of composing were used, including music played by electronic instruments or very modern music using strange sounds (experimental or "avant garde' music), for example the music of John Cage. Some people feel that this kind of music cannot really be described as "classical music".

Classical music is a very general term which normally refers to the standard music of countries in the Western world. It is music that has been composed by musicians who are trained in the art of writing music (composing) and written down in music notation so that other musicians can play it. Classical music may also be described as "art music" though it was not good in classical period. That term also includes types of serious modern music which are not classical. Classical music differs from pop music because it is not made just in order to be popular for time or just to be a commercial success. It is different from folk music which is generally made up by ordinary members of society and learned by future generations by listening, dancing and copying.

Contrast with Pop Music and Jazz

Although people sometimes think of classical music as the opposite of pop music, it can still be very popular. Like all kinds of music, classical music can be in many different moods: happy, sad, scary, peaceful, thoughtful, simple etc. Mozart wrote his serenades and divertimentos to entertain people at parties. Classical pieces of

music can be quite short, but they can also be very long, like a big, musical story. A symphony by Mahler or Shostakovich can last for nearly an hour, and an opera is a whole evening's entertainment.

Classical music is also different from jazz because true jazz is improvised. However, the differences are not always obvious. Classical music has often been inspired by jazz, and jazz by classical music. George Gershwin wrote music which is both jazz and classical. Classical music, too, can be improvised. The great composers Bach, Mozart and Beethoven often improvised long pieces of music on the organ, harpsichord or piano. Sometimes they wrote these improvisations down. They were, in effect, compositions which were composed in one go.

Instruments Used

Classical music can be for instruments or for the voice. The symphony orchestra is the most common group of instruments for the playing of classical music. It has four families of instruments: the string instruments which include the violins, violas, cellos and piano, the woodwind instruments which include flutes, oboes, clarinets and bassoons together with related instruments of different sizes, the brass instruments: trumpet, trombone, tuba and French horn, and percussion instruments which nearly always includes timpani as well as many other possible instruments which are hit or shaken. This is very different from a typical rock band which has a drummer, a guitarist, one or two singers and an electric bass and keyboard. Instruments that play classical music are not normally amplified electronically.

The same applies to the voice. Singers may be sopranos, altos, tenors or basses, depending on their vocal range. Their voices are not amplified. Opera singers, in particular, have to develop very powerful voices which will be heard over the orchestra and project right to the back of an opera house.

The instruments used in classical music developed at different times. Some of the earliest were known in Medieval music. The trombone and the triangle have hardly changed for hundreds of years, but the violin family developed from folk instruments such as fiddles and gradually replaced the viols to form the basis of the modern orchestra. This was happening by the beginning of the 17th century, which was the time when opera was invented.

In general, musical instruments have become louder as concert halls have become bigger. Violins are louder than viols. Modern violins are louder than the early 17th century violins, largely because of they have metal strings instead of gut strings. The piano developed from the clavichord which was very quiet indeed. Woodwind instruments developed from Renaissance instruments, while the clarinet was invented in the middle of the 18th century, and the saxophone and tuba came even later. Modern trumpets sound much brighter than the straight trumpets of the 18th century.

Form (Shape) of Classical Music Pieces

Most popular music is based on song form, but classical music has many different forms, some of which can be used over a long time span to make big compositions. Classical music can have many forms, including the symphony, concerto, oratorio, opera, sonata, fugue or any combination of dance movements such as suites. In many of the longer compositions, short tunes are developed and changed during the course of the piece. Beethoven's Fifth Symphony is a good example of a piece which develops from just four notes into a large piece lasting about half an hour.

Musical Training and General Use of Classical Music

People who want to be good at performing classical music have to practice hard for many years. They normally have formal training at a music college or conservatoire and have lessons from wellknown music teachers.

Classical musicians often spend a lot of time thinking carefully about pieces of music, especially about pieces of music that they perform. They study such things as harmony and counterpoint to help them understand the way that the composers were thinking when they put the piece together. When they look at pieces of music in this way this is called "musical analysis". People who specialize in thinking and writing about music may become professors or lecturers of music at universities.

Classical music is often heard in popular culture. It is used as background music for movies, television programs, advertisements and even for mobile phone ringing tones. Most people in the Western world recognize many classical tunes, possibly without even realizing it. Some classical pieces of music have become enormously popular, e.g. the song *Nessun dorma* from Giacomo Puccini's opera *Turandot* which was sung by the three tenors Luciano Pavarotti, Placido Domingo and José Carreras, and used as the theme tune for the 1990 Soccer World Cup. This made many people who had never been interested in opera start to become curious about it.


Singing

Singing is the act of producing musical sounds with the voice and augments regular speech by the use of sustained tonality, rhythm, and a variety of vocal techniques. A person who sings is called a singer or vocalist. Singers perform music (arias, recitatives, songs, etc.) that can be sung with or without accompaniment by musical instruments. Singing is often done in an ensemble of musicians, such as a choir of singers or a band of instrumentalists. Singers may perform as soloists or accompanied by anything from a single instrument (as in art song or some jazz styles) up to a symphony orchestra or big band. Different singing styles include art music such as opera and Chinese opera, Hindustani music, and religious music styles such as gospel, traditional music styles, world music, jazz, blues, gazal and popular music styles such as pop, rock, electronic dance music.

Singing can be formal or informal, arranged or improvised. It may be done as a form of religious devotion, as a hobby, as a source of pleasure, comfort, or ritual, as part of music education, or as a profession. Excellence in singing requires time, dedication, instruction, and regular practice. If practice is done on a regular basis, then the sounds can become more clear and strong. Professional singers usually build their careers around one specific musical genre, such as classical or rock, although there are singers with crossover success (singing in more than one genre). They typically take voice training provided by voice teachers or vocal coaches throughout their careers.

Soprano

A soprano is a female singer with a high voice. Young boys who sing, and also girls, are usually called trebles. The word "soprano" can also refer to the top line of choir music. This would be sung by sopranos or trebles. Soprano is also used as a name for high pitched instruments, such as a soprano saxophone.



In opera there are different kinds of soprano voices:

• A dramatic soprano will sing big, dramatic roles such as Aida in Verdi's opera *Aida*.

- A coloratura soprano will have a light voice which can bounce up to very high notes (the Queen of the Night in Mozart's *Magic Flute* goes up to top F (2 ½ octaves above middle C).
 - A soubrette is usually the maid or a young girl who flirts.
- A lyric soprano role needs a beautiful smooth voice, e.g. Mimi in Puccini's *La Boheme*.
- A heavy dramatic soprano is needed in many of Wagner's operas, e.g. Isolde in *Tristan und Isolde* or Brunnhilde in *Der Ring des Nibelungen*.
- In the 17th and 18th centuries, many of the soprano roles were written for male sopranos. Called a castrato, they were men who had their testicles removed before puberty so that their voices would remain high pitched.

Alto

The word alto can mean: someone who sings lower than a soprano. Usually females with lower voices are called contraltos. A male alto is a man who sings in a special way called falsetto. In England male altos sing in church and cathedral choirs. In some countries like Germany it is tradition to have boy altos in cathedral choirs. These will probably be boys whose voices will soon be breaking and are starting to get lower.

One of the most famous contraltos was Kathleen Ferrier. There are not so many female singers who call themselves contraltos these days. It has become more fashionable to be a mezzo-soprano. It is partly because it has become fashionable to use men for the alto parts in music by Bach and other Baroque composers, like it would have been performed in those days.

Operatic roles which need a contralto include Lucretia in Britten's Rape of Lucretia and Erda in Wagner's Der Ring des Nibelungen.

The word *alto* can also mean: the second line down in 4 part choir music. In old music the alto line was written in a special clef called the "alto clef", which is the same as the "viola clef" (a C clef in which the middle line is middle C).

Tenor

Vocal range of a tenor. Note that the "8" below the key means the notes are an octave lower than shown.

A tenor is a man with a high singing voice. In opera the role of the young male is usually sung by a tenor. Depending on characteristics such as: volume, color and style, the tenor voice is classified in following groups:



The light tenor. This is also called tenor leggero. An example is Peter Pears, who sang the tenor solos in Benjamin Britten's operas.

The lyric tenor. The lyric tenor is a tenor with a well timbered voice, such as "The Three Tenors" (Luciano Pavarotti, Jose Carreras and Placido Domingo).

The spinto tenor. They have special abilities in the high tones, such as Franco Corelli and Enrico Caruso.

The dramatic tenor. They have a high volume and a dark voice. An example is Mario Del Monaco.

A "Heldentenor" (German for "hero tenor") is someone with a big tenor voice. This is suitable for heroic parts like the heroes in most of Wagner's operas. Lauritz Melchior, Max Lorenz and Jonas Kaufmann are famous heroic tenors.

The Mozart tenor with characteristics including all of the previous mentioned must be able to perform within the strict borders which are laid out by the Mozart style. Anton Dermota, Fritz Wunderlich and Francisco Araiza are the three leading people as Mozart tenor.

When writing four-part choir music the tenor line will be the third line down, between alto and bass. It is usually written in the treble clef, but will sound an octave lower than written. Sometimes, it is written in the "C-clef", which is also called a tenor clef.

In barbershop singing, the tenor part is a harmony part sung predominantly higher than the melody.

Bass (Vocal Range)

A bass is a type of male singing voice and possesses the lowest vocal range of all voice types. According to The New Grove Dictionary of Opera, a bass is typically classified as having a range extending from around the second E below middle C to the E above middle C (i.e., E2–E4). Its tessitura, or comfortable range, is normally defined by the outermost lines of the bass clef.




